In humble praver we ask you, almighty God: command that these gifts be borne by the hands of your holy Angel to your altar on high in the sight of your divine majesty. so that all of us, who through this participation at the altar receive the most holy Body and Blood of your Son, may be filled with every grace and heavenly blessing.

Remember also, Lord, your servants N. and N., who have gone before us with the sign of faith and rest in the sleep of peace. Grant them, O Lord, we pray, and all who sleep in Christ, a place of refreshment, light and peace.

To us, also, your servants, who, though sinners, hope in your abundant mercies, graciously grant some share and fellowship with your holy Apostles and Martyrs: with John the Baptist, Stephen, Matthias, Barnabas, [...] and all your Saints: admit us, we beseech you, into their company, not weighing our merits, but granting us your pardon, through Christ our Lord.

Through whom vou continue to make all these good things. O Lord: you sanctify them, fill them with life. bless them, and bestow them upon us.

The Communion Rite

The Priest invites all to join in the Lord's Praver:

The Priest continues alone:

Deliver us, Lord, we pray, ... For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours now and for ever.

The Priest says:

Lord Jesus Christ... Amen. The peace of the Lord be with you always. And with your spirit.

The Deacon. or the Priest. adds: Let us offer each other the sign of peace. All then make an appropriate sign of peace.

The Priest takes the host and breaks it. Meanwhile the people say or sing:

Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us. Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world.

The Priest shows the host to the people and says:

Therefore, Lord, we pray:

graciously accept this oblation of our service. that of your whole family: order our days in your peace, and command that we be delivered from eternal damnation and counted among the flock of those you have chosen.

Be pleased, O God, we pray, to bless, acknowledge, and approve this offering in every respect; make it spiritual and acceptable, so that it may become for us the Body and Blood of your most beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ.
