give kind admittance to your kingdom. There we hope to enjoy for ever the fullness of your glory through Christ our Lord, through whom you bestow on the world all that is good.

Through him, and with him, and in him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honour is yours, for ever and ever.

The people acclaim: Amen.

The Communion Rite

Stand

The Priest invites all to join in the Lord's Prayer: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses. as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation,

but deliver us from evil. The Priest continues alone:

Deliver us. Lord, we pray, from every evil. graciously grant peace in our days. that, by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress. as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. For the kingdom. the power and the glory are yours now and for ever.

The Priest says:

Lord Jesus Christ. who said to your Apostles: Peace I leave you, my peace I give you, look not on our sins. but on the faith of your Church. and graciously grant her peace and unity in accordance with your will. Who live and reign for ever and ever. Amen.

The peace of the Lord be with you always. And with your spirit.

The Deacon, or the Priest, adds:

Let us offer each other the sign of peace.

The Priest takes the host and breaks it. Meanwhile the people say or sing:

Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us.

Preface VI of the Sundays in Ordinary Time The pledge of the eternal Passover

(The Priest may use a different Preface.) It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God.

For in you we live and move and have our being. and while in this body

we not only experience the daily effects of your care. but even now possess the pledge of life eternal.

For, having received the first fruits of the Spirit, through whom you raised up Jesus from the dead, we hope for an everlasting share in the Paschal Mystery.

And so, with all the Angels, we praise you. as in joyful celebration we acclaim:

on whose constant intercession in your presence we rely for unfailing help.

May this Sacrifice of our reconciliation, we pray. O Lord. advance the peace and salvation of all the world. Be pleased to confirm in faith and charity your pilgrim Church on earth. with your servant N. our Pope and N. our Bishop, the Order of Bishops, all the clergy, and the entire people you have gained for your own.

Listen graciously to the prayers of this family, whom you have summoned before you: in your compassion, O merciful Father, gather to yourself all your children scattered throughout the world.

To our departed brothers and sisters and to all who were pleasing to you at their passing from this life.
